Reporting of side effects: If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in the package leaflet. By reporting side effects, you can help provide more information on the safety of this medicine.

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## If you are a woman of child-bearing age:

#### **Pregnancy**

Ambrisentan may harm unborn babies conceived before, during or soon after treatment.

#### If you are a woman:

- You must not take Ambrisentan if you are pregnant, or if you are planning to become pregnant
- Women of reproductive potential must use reliable contraception whilst taking Ambrisentan
- It is preferable that you and your partner use two forms of contraception that work in different ways - If you are in any doubt about which contraceptives to use, consult your doctor or contraceptive clinic
- A pregnancy test should be taken every month
- If you miss a period, or if you think you may be pregnant, you must tell your doctor straight away

### For all patients: Liver Function Blood Test

Ambrisentan may cause liver injury.

It is important to have blood tests to monitor your liver function before starting treatment and at regular intervals during treatment to check that your liver is working properly. Monthly liver function tests are recommended.
