You should avoid exposure to direct sunlight during Voriconazole Pfizer treatment. It is important to cover sun exposed areas of skin and use sufficient sunscreen with high sun protection factor (SPF), as an increased sensitivity of skin to the sun's UV rays can occur. There is a small chance that skin cancer could develop over time.

Please ensure you **undergo all follow-up visits** for blood tests or skin evaluations arranged by your doctor. Please have a list of all your other medicines and medical conditions available at each visit to a healthcare professional.

**You should contact your doctor immediately if you experience:** sunburn or severe skin reaction following exposure to light or sun.

**Reporting of Side effects:** If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in the package leaflet.
